About the BritishSpanish Society

The BritishSpanish Society's history dates back to 1916 when it was formed as the Anglo-Spanish Society. Founded by a group of British academics, students and businessmen, the aim of the Society in its early days was to forge social, cultural and trade friendships with Spain. Whilst the world (and the name of the Society) may have changed significantly in the 100+ years of the Society its core values remain consistent.

In 2008 a new dimension, building on the academic foundations of the Society, was introduced and the Society started a scholarship programme to support talented post-graduates with their research projects. In its 16-year history the scholarship programme has awarded over 100 scholarships and provided over £825,000 in financial support. The programme has also provided networking opportunities for business leaders and scholarship winners leading to exciting partnerships and events.

The Society funds its charitable mission through its cultural and social programme of events, providing a varied calendar of 'puntos de encuentro' for its members and business opportunities for its supporters.

Your continuing support allows us to develop our charity's mission of bridges of cultural building educational dialoque and understanding between the peoples of the UK and Spain. It enables us to continue and augment investment in our scholarship programme, now in its 17th year, which identifies and encourages talented young British and Spanish post-graduate researchers.

The programme, the 'beating heart' of our charity's mission, strengthens institutional links between the UK and Spain, and sponsors research in leading UK and Spanish universities. To date we have supported over 100 postgraduates from both countries, sponsoring research in fields as diverse as medicine, urban planning, engineering, linguistics, literature, law, physics, environment protection, and music.

The sustainability of the programme depends on the continuing support of our corporate sponsors, but also critically on donations from members and patrons.

We continue to pursue tirelessly our strategy of engagement and enlightenment through a diverse events programme in both countries, creating 'puntos de encuentro', or meeting points where we learn about the best of each other's cultures and build friendships.

Our events calendar includes talks, arts tours, wine tastings, and social gatherings including those at the Spanish embassy in London, and the British embassy in Madrid, courtesy of the ambassadors, our honorary president and honorary vice-president.

Another area of our activity is the publication of our flagship magazine La Revista, published three times per year, and distributed to our members, and partners in the UK and Spain. With informative news about our activities, the magazine offers a varied selection of interviews and articles with editorial content ranging from arts, literature and sport to music, food and travel, all written by our expert contributors in both English and Spanish.

We continue to develop our communications, via our website, social media, and emailed newsletter and announcements, keeping our members and friends

informed of our activities and providing platforms for our sponsors.

Our membership in both continues to grow through word of mouth and introduction at our events, helping to develop a diverse and vibrant multi-cultural community. The 2023 Scholarship ceremony took place at the Spanish Embassy in Belgrave Square, London, hosted by Spanish ambassador José Pascual Marco Martinez.

As in previous years we received applications from a large number of exceptional candidates with wide ranging projects. Our winning scholars presented a brief overview of their projects and their anticipated impact, taking questions from Trustee Mike Short. Seven Scholarships totalling £63,000, and supported by BBVA, Fundación Cañada Blanch, Cuatrecasas, Plastic Energy and Santander Universities, were awarded to the winning scholars.




Social

Our members are the Society. Members share a common desire to promote and celebrate Spanish culture in the UK and British culture in Spain.






